The meeting was call to order by Mayor Verga at 7:02 pm, followed by the National Anthem, Pledge of Allegiance, and a moment of silence.

Mayor Verga moved, Mr. Cochran 2nd. to approve the minutes from Aug 12, 2019. All members voice voted yea. Motion approved.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Verga also advised to stop the hunt for a new service truck and keep maintaining it but to continue looking for a dump truck.

VILLAGE SOLICITOR

FISCAL OFFICER

Mr.Faulkner, Fiscal Officer reported the appropriations status on the propane went from \$4400 to \$6000 We have 400 gallons owed to us by Thrifty propane (tanks hold 1000 gallons).

COUNCIL'S GUEST & PUBLIC COMENTS ON THE AGENDA ITEMS

Mr. Sean Campbell spoke about the bids for repair on old 73, bidding will be next month. Mr Campbell looked at the sink hole prior to the council meeting and observed a catch basin already implemented down the roadway and therefore does not feel it deemed necessary to put in another catch basin and spend unnecessary funds. No asphalt repair is needed for church driveway. Mr Campbell also advised to go with lower bid at 3500, both are good contractors and he recommends we go with one of them.he did advise not to go with Smith Co.

Mike Hatfield proposed the village take up roadway, and approve village employees to take up roadway and dump to obtain bobcat since we do not have heavy duty equipment. Mr. Campbell advised no on this proposal. If Village were to obtain a bobcat we would have to maintain it and would have to justify the money spent to do so.

It was also brought up by Mr.Cochran and Mr. Camp to rent equipment when needed and it would save on monies spent. Also if work is needed done beyond service mens ability that we not have them proceed due to the chance they might do it incorrectly or cause unneeded damage to property or themselves.
