ORDINANCE NO. 2018-002

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING, ADOPTING AND ENACTING AMERICAN LEGAL PUBLISHING'S OHIO BASIC CODE, 2018 EDITION, AS THE CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE MUNICIPALITY OF HOUSE SOURCE, OHIO, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the present general and permanent ordinances of the municipality are inadequately arranged and classified and are insufficient in form and substance for the complete preservation of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare of the municipality and for the proper conduct of its affairs.

WHEREAS, American Legal Publishing Corporation publishes a Code of Ordinances suitable for adoption by municipalities in Ohio.

WHEREAS, it is necessary to provide for the usual daily operation of the municipality and for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare of the municipality that this ordinance take effect at an early date.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF HARVEYS BUYER, OHIO:

- American Legal Publishing's Ohio Basic Code, 2018 Edition, as reviewed and approved by the Legislative Authority, is hereby adopted and enacted. Any prior version of the Ohio Basic Code which may have been previously adopted by the municipality is hereby repealed as obsolete and is hereby replaced in its entirety by this Ohio Basic Code, 2018 Edition.
- One copy of Applican Legal Bishing's Ohio Basic Code, 2018 Edition, certified as correct by the Mayor and Clerk of the Legislative Authority, as required by Ohio Revised Code § 731.23, shall be kept in its initial form on file in the office of the Clerk of the municipality and retained as a permanent ordinance record of the municipality. The Clerk of the municipality is authorized and directed to publish a summary of all new matters contained in the Code of Ordinances as required by Ohio Revised Code § 731.23. Such summary is attached hereto and marked as "Exhibit A".
- Section 3. All ordinances and resolutions or parts thereof which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of the Ohio Basic Code, 2018 Edition, as adopted in Section 1 hereof, are hereby repealed as of the effective date of this ordinance, except as follows:
 - (A) The enactment of the Ohio Basic Code, 2018 Edition, shall not be construed to affect a right or liability accrued or incurred under any legislative provision prior to the effective date of such enactment, or an action or proceeding for the enforcement of such right or liability. Such enactment shall not be construed to relieve any person from punishment for an act committed in violation of any such legislative provision, nor to affect an indictment or prosecution therefor. For such purposes, any such legislative provision shall continue in full force notwithstanding its repeal for the purpose of revision and codification.

- (B) The repeal provided above shall not affect:
 - (1) The grant or creation of a franchise, license, right, easement or privilege;
 - (2) The purchase, sale, lease or transfer of property;
 - (3) The appropriation or expenditure of money or promise or guarantee of payment;
 - (4) The assumption of any contract or obligation;
 - (5) The issuance and delivery of any bonds, obligations or other instruments of indebtedness;
 - (6) The levy or imposition of taxes, assessments or charges;
 - (7) The establishment, naming, vacating or grade level of any street or public way;
 - (8) The dedication of property or plat approval;
 - (9) The annexation or detachment of territory;
 - (10) Any legislation enacted subsequent to the adoption of this ordinance.
 - (11) Any legislation specifically superseding the provision of the Ohio Basic Code.
- Whenever reference is made in any documents, publications, or signs of the municipality, including but not limited to traffic tickets and traffic-control signs, to a section as it existed in a former edition of the Ohio Basic Code, the reference shall extend and apply to the section referred to as subsequently amended, revised, recodified, or renumbered.
- Section 5. This ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health, safety and general welfare of the people of this municipality, and shall take effect at the earliest date provided by law.

COUNCIL

MEETING WITH AUDITOR — Chief Pottenger, Fiscal Officer Faulkner, and myself met with the Auditor on January 31, 2018. The purpose of the meeting was to present an updated inventory listing regarding Harveysburg's assets and to discuss preparing a purchasing policy. Several issues were addressed by staff including using Village monies for the purpose of village sponsored events using village funds. Basically the auditor advised that using village funds for such events, with the Council's approval, is acceptable. The subject of employee gifts and luncheon around the Christmas holiday was also discussed. The question of whether village funds can be used to purchase Christmas gifts to employees and provide a Christmas luncheon <u>is</u> acceptable as long as the Village Solicitor indicates in writing that it is legal to do so, and that Council approves same.

EMPLOYEE LUNCHEON AND CHRISTMAS GIFTS - I am requesting our Village Solicitor check into the legality of providing our Village employees some type of Christmas gift and to provide a luncheon for our employees during the Christmas season. If same is legal, I am requesting Council approve same either in the form of a resolution or majority council vote.

ELDERLY OR HANDICAP ASSISTANCE — In the past, on few occasions, the Street Department Personnel has assisted the elderly or the handicap during bad weather conditions. I know of at least one incident where an elderly resident requested our help in clearing her driveway free of snow because she had a doctor's appointment. Our Street Department assisted her and she was able to keep her appointment. The Auditor has no problem with this along as Council is made aware of it. I am requesting that Council approve the assistance, on a case by case basis, of the elderly or handicap when the need arises. A vote is not necessary but I would like to know of any concerns you may have. I think this would be another way we can works towards being a resident friendly village.

ROOF LEAK – During the last cold spell, the roof above the kitchen and back door entryway (near piano) developed a leak. Street personnel assessed the problem and determined it to be a flashing and gutter issue. The gutter was cleaned out and the flashing will be sealed with silicone as weather permits. The roof affected is a small metal covered section in the rear of the gym.

WATER LEAK – For several months the village has noticed water usage increasing slightly indicating a possible leak somewhere. Our Street personnel had checked many times over the course of several months to locate any leaks with negative results. In mid-January, water was observed gushing up from the meter pit in front of the building. Warren County Water was called and they discovered a leak adjacent to the water meter and immediately fixed the problem. Warren County did an excellent job and responded within 30 minutes.

DAMAGED ROADS — This winter has played havoc on our roadways. Because of the freezing and thawing, at least two major areas have been affected, Loraine Avenue and E. Main Street. The Main Street roadway seemed to happen overnight and appears to keep growing. The street buckled up slightly so at first we thought maybe a water leak had developed. Warren County Water came out two different times and they determined it was not a water leak. It appears to have been caused by freezing and thawing. Unfortunately Loraine Avenue is in bad repair and has been for quite some time. Even though we are working with our Engineer to help resolve the water problem in that area, the roadway just keeps getting worse. Last year, part of Loarine Avenue was paved and now it appears that more work needs to be done.

Intelliwave conducted a survey of residents before coming to council for the presentation, there is interest in this kind of service. Mr. Thornton's presentation included technical details, operations, customer cost to subscribe and the Village's ownership of the water tower – for locating antennas for the service. Discussions followed from

both council members and citizens attending. Solicitor Joe Lucas recommended to council that they recess to EXECUTIVE SESSION to discuss specific items.
