Harveysburg PD report: Chief Pottenger

Vehicles are running well. There are no major events to report.

We have received 2 new applications.

Training has begun for the new hires.

Police Committee Minutes – July 10, 2023

Chief Pottenger gives thanks to Dave Crisenberry for providing volunteers and funds to have the 25th Fishing Derby.

Chief Pottenger states that Officer Roat would like to begin hosting a Junior Police Academy for children ages 10-15. This academy would last 4 days between the hours of 10am-12pm. The event would be at no cost to the Village. It would cover equipment used by police, traffic stops, cuffing a subject, running radar, a tour of the fire department, a team building obstacle course, self-defense techniques, and a K-9 demonstration. Officer Roat would donate her time for this event and believes she has all over expenses covered. Chief Pottenger and Lt. Perkins will be on hand to supervise the academy.

Mr. Tipton asks if Officer Cruse has returned his equipment yet. Chief Pottenger states he is supposed to return everything tomorrow. He should be returning his badge, department ID, vest, and ammunition.

Chief Pottenger states that Ofc. Kiser did well on his first shifts out on his own.

Chief Pottenger asks if we should start paying our new hires right away due to the issue with Workman's Comp or if we should let them get through all their training first. It will go through the Fiscal Officer before it's decided.

Mr. Tipton shows the police operations data through fiscal week 25. There have been 90 shifts worked, 590 hours worked, and 149 citations.

Mr. Trovillo asks when the cruiser will be taken care of. Chief Pottenger would like to get it stripped as soon as possible, but Mr. Kirby is still dealing with the insurance company.
